INTRODUCTION

- What are PC skills?
 - Most common tasks we use computers for:
 - Web browsing, Email, Finances, Picture/video storage/sorting, Gaming, Recipes, Genealogy, etc.
- Why are they important?
 - Get the most out of your application
 - Tuning & performance
 - Unnecessary upgrades

GETTING FAMILIAR WITH THE COMPUTER

- Understanding hardware: monitor, keyboard, mouse, CPU
 - USB A vs USB C
 - Video output types
 - VGA, DVI, HDMI
- Basic software components: operating system, applications
 - OS Windows, Mac, Linux, etc.
- Memory (RAM) vs disk storage

NAVIGATING THE DESKTOP

- Icons, taskbar, and start menu
 - Locate applications
 - Power functions off, sleep, hibernate
- Opening and closing programs
 - Minimize, maximize, resume
 - X vs file/close

FILE MANAGEMENT

- Creating, saving, and organizing files
 - File name + file extension
 - Importance of file extensions
- Using folders efficiently
 - Best aid in locating & organizing to your needs

INTERNET & WEB BROWSING

- Using browsers: Chrome, Edge, Firefox
 - Edge & Chrome share same code base differences in menus & security defaults
- Searching effectively with search engines
 - Use recognized known ones Google, Bing, DuckDuckGo

EMAIL & COMMUNICATION TOOLS

- Setting up an email account
 - Microsoft Outlook.com, Google Gmail.com
- Sending and receiving emails
 - 3rd party (outlook, Thunderbird, etc.) can be troublesome
 - Direct web-based work well Gmail, Outlook, Spectrum, etc.

BASIC TROUBLESHOOTING

- Common issues and quick fixes
 - Slow usually hard drive wear/failure seldom memory related
 - Replace mechanical (HDD) with Solid State drive (SSD)
 - Use Task Manager to isolate likely cause check Startup programs
- Restarting and updating the system
 - Apply Windows updates regularly
 - Do not use 3rd party tools developed for older Windows versions
 - CCleaner, Defragmenters, Driver updaters, Memory/Registry cleaners, Anti Virus (AV)

CYBERSECURITY BASICS

- Importance of strong passwords
 - Phrases work well
- Recognizing phishing attempts and scams
 - Do NOT react to sudden pop-ups
 - Never call numbers displayed
 - Don't click questionable email links
 - Never give remote access to your device
 - Malwarebytes only paid/add-on recommended
